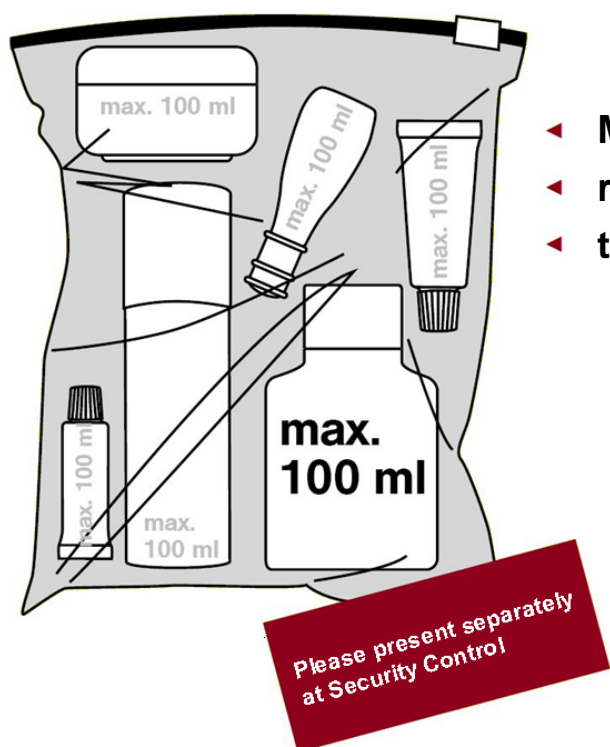


Bringing liquids on board - if you are departing from an airport located outside the EC

In compliance with international security regulations, any liquid items (including gels, pastes and similar) which are carried into the aircraft cabin must be packed in individual containers with a capacity of not more than 100ml (1 dl). These containers must themselves be carried in a re-sealable transparent plastic bag with a maximum capacity of one litre, to enable them to be separately screened at airport security checkpoints.

- ◀ **re-sealable (e.g. zip-top)**
- ◀ **transparent**

Exempt from the new rule are medicines (e.g. diabetic kits) and Baby Food needed during the flight

Higher quantities of liquids (not exceeding two litres) can still be transported in your checked baggage (registered baggage) as long as they do not belong to the category of "Dangerous Goods".

Your possibilities to purchase **Liquid Duty Free Articles** are as follows:

- at the Tax-free Shop of your departure airport (if you don't have a connecting flight in Switzerland)
- aboard your SWISS flight to Switzerland (except when continuing to USA)
- at the Tax-free Shops in Switzerland
- aboard your SWISS onward flight from Switzerland

These goods must be packed and sealed to allow you to pass the security control points at any airport located in one of the member states of the European Community.
